

The Police Treatment Centres Lottery: Full Terms and Conditions:

1. These Terms and Conditions are the Lottery Rules. By entering the lottery, entrants agree to be bound by these rules.
2. This lottery is being promoted by and on behalf of The Police Treatment Centres
3. For the purpose of the Gambling Act 2005, this lottery is defined as a 'Society Lottery.'
4. This lottery is licensed by Harrogate Borough Council.
5. To enter the lottery, you must be resident in the United Kingdom, Northern Ireland or the Isle Of Man and aged 16 (sixteen) or over.
6. The Charity's aim is to give away 7 cash prizes a month with a total maximum prize pot of £1,500 per month, which breaks down as follows: £1,000 (66.6% of the total prize pot), £200 (13.3% of the total prize pot), £100 (6.6% of the total prize pot), and 4 x £50 (3.3% of the total prize pot). This prize giveaway will be possible when there are at least 2,500 entries into the lottery. If there are fewer entries than this, the total prize pot will be made up of 50% of the monthly proceeds, and will be broken down by the same percentages shown previously into the 7 prizes. There will be 7 guaranteed monthly cash winners, although additional prizes could be offered from time to time.
7. All tickets shall be priced at £1
8. All lottery entry sales are final and no refunds shall be made at any time. All entrants acknowledge that their payment of £1 per ticket to enter the lottery does not guarantee that they will win any prize.
9. The draw for the prizes will be made at our lottery management company's premises to be held monthly. You do not need to be present at the draw to win the lottery. However a list of winners are available by phoning us on Tel: 01423 504448
10. If a cash prize is awarded, this will be made by cheque in the name of the entrant only.
11. The Police Treatment Centres reserves the right in exceptional and unforeseen circumstances to substitute any of the non cash prizes acquired for the lottery for a similar prize at The Police Treatment Centres absolute discretion.
12. Full payment for each ticket must be received either in the form of cash or cleared funds before the ticket can be entered into the draw. Only tickets for which full payment has been received either in the form of cash or cleared funds is eligible to win the prize.
13. The winners of the lottery prizes will be notified by letter.
14. All entrants are solely responsible for providing The Police Treatment Centres with their accurate and up-to-date contact details and The Police Treatment Centres will be in no way liable for any failure or inability to contact any entrant due to any errors, omissions or inaccuracies in the contact details that the entrant has provided. In the event that an entrant changes their contact details, they will be solely responsible for advising The Police Treatment Centres of the change.
15. By accepting the prize, the winner agrees to take part in promotional activity unless they have specified "No Publicity" and The Police Treatment Centres reserves the right to use the name and location of the winner, their photograph and audio and/or visual recordings of them in any publicity unless prior notification has been received.
16. Each game number is unique. A randomly selected game number will be issued with the confirmation of entry. Any member may subsequently request an alternative game number if they wish at any time and this will be issued providing that it has not already been allocated to an existing member.
17. Lottery membership can be cancelled at any time by notifying The Police Treatment Centres in writing, by phone or via e-mail.
18. The Police Treatment Centres shall not be liable to the member for any loss or damage suffered or arising from:-
 - any delays or failures in the postal service or other delivery methods used by The Police Treatment Centres or the member from time to time.
 - any delays or failures in any software or other systems used by The Police Treatment Centres for the administration of the lottery.
 - any delays or failures in the Banking system used by The Police Treatment Centres or the member.
 - any refusal by The Police Treatment Centres to accept registration of an individual as a member or the cancellation of a member.
 - any failure to enter a chance into the draw.
 - any event beyond the reasonable control of The Police Treatment Centres.
19. Nothing within these terms and conditions shall create or should be construed as creating any form of contract between any entrant and The Police Treatment Centres.

20. Any complaints relating to the lottery should be sent in writing to The Police Treatment Centres giving full details of the complaint and supporting documentation.
21. The Police Treatment Centres is committed to protecting the privacy of lottery members. Data that is collected from the member is used lawfully in accordance with the Data Protection Act 2018 and is used solely by Sterling Lotteries, our lottery management company, for the purpose of processing lottery chances, subsequent entry into the lottery draw, and informing winners that they have won a prize. With your permission, as a lottery member and supporter, The Police Treatment Centres will also keep in touch with you about the vital work it does for the Police Family, its fundraising appeals and other opportunities to support the charity. The information you have provided will be kept safely and securely.
22. Any member has the right to access the information held about them. To obtain this information, please contact The Police Treatment Centres in writing.
23. The Police Treatment Centres will not grant access of any personal data to any third party other than Sterling Lotteries. The Police Treatment Centres will never sell or rent your data.
24. The Police Treatment Centres will retain your data until you withdraw your consent by emailing fundraising@thepolicetreatmentcentres.org
25. In the event of any dispute regarding the rules, the decision of The Police Treatment Centres shall be final and no correspondence or discussion shall be entered into.
26. The Police Treatment Centres reserves the right to amend these rules at any time. If The Police Treatment Centres does this, it will publish the amended rules.
27. The Police Treatment Centres reserves the right to disqualify any entrant if it has reasonable grounds to believe the entrant has breached any of these rules.
28. The Police Treatment Centres member responsible for the promotion of the lottery is Peter Moore.
29. Neither The Police Treatment Centres nor our lottery management company shall be liable to you in contract, tort, negligence or otherwise for any indirect or consequential loss suffered by you in relation to your participation in the Lottery (including loss of the opportunity to enter the Lottery and / or the chance of winning a prize).
30. Each entrant should retain a copy of these Terms and Conditions for their reference.
