#### **New Wing Honours UK's First Black Police Officer**

In September this year the PTC officially opened the new PC John Kent Wing of our Harrogate Centre. Mr Andrew George, President of the National Black Police Association, did the honours of unveiling the plaque to mark the opening of this new extension to our St. Andrews Centre.

The wing has been named in honour of PC John Kent who is credited as being Britain's first Black Police Officer, overcoming discrimination and a hostile environment from both colleagues and the public alike. John Kent passed away in July 1886, paying the way for future generations of Black Police Officers within the Police fraternity and the PTC are proud to name one of its wings after this pioneer in British policing.





The John Kent Wing is part of our new major expansion of the St. Andrews Centre, which sees the creation of a new Centre of Excellence at the Harrogate site. This will focus on supporting the wellbeing of the Police Family, with an expansion to the existing Psychological Wellbeing Programme at the Police Treatment Centres and the start of a strategic partnership between Police Care UK and the PTC.

Together, the charities aim to establish the Centre as a national specialist facility focusing on building resilience to better support the wellbeing of officers and staff and providing access to treatment that reflects the needs of policing, and potentially developing a specific Post Traumatic Stress programme in the future.



This unique event will see 50,000 people take on the marathon distance but on their own course in their local area. Along with the 50,000 participants running the streets of London the runners will make history by creating the World's very first 100,000 person marathon. Amy Hunter and Hannah Blundell have already chosen to take on the challenge for the PTC and both are well under way with their training and their fundraising.

### National Recruitment Campaign and Amnesty

The PTC have embarked on a National Recruitment Campaign during the months of September and October this year. The Campaign will encourage all those Serving Officers, Retired Officers, PCSO's, Detention & Custody Officers, and Special Constables who do not currently donate to the PTC to sign-up and become eligible for our free first class services.

The Campaign will be accompanied by an Amnesty from the usual need to donate for 12 months before becoming eligible to apply for treatment and will allow those signing up during the period of the campaign, with an existing injury or condition, to apply for treatment straight away, subject to clinical approval and current waiting times.

Throughout the Campaign period representatives of the charity will be out and about visiting stations to promote our facilities and services. We will also be running a number of virtual information sessions offering virtual tours of each Centre, sessions about our Physiotherapy and Psychological Wellbeing Programmes and Question and Answer sessions. These sessions will be by Microsoft Teams and you can either sign up through our website or just contact us to book in for a session.
