Psychological Wellbeing Programme

In our autumn newsletter we told you about the proposed changes that were being made to the care and treatment given to non-physio patients, those people who attend the Centres for support following stress or illness. With effect from January 2016, patients are now able to apply specifically for admission to the new Psychological Wellbeing Programme and be offered a more structured treatment package. All patients wishing to apply must complete two psychometric tests alongside their application form, which assists in allowing a better assessment of their needs.

Thanks to the incredibly generous donation of £75,000 from the Blue Lamp Foundation, the programme has been able to provide further benefits including:

- Relaxation classes, available every day and additional Thai Chi classes;
- A new aromatherapy class providing information on the best oils to use for different ailments:
- Sleep workshops; providing advice and recommended techniques to use;
- Changes to Patient Advisor hours,

- almost doubling what was previously available, providing each patient with an average of 3.5hrs of dedicated counselling;
- The Leeds Art Gallery lending scheme, providing specifically selected pieces of art, to help enhance an individual's wellbeing.

We hope to be able to provide some positive feedback from patients who have accessed the new programme in our summer newsletter. Look out for further information next time!

Paws for a M&ment

Here at the Police Treatment Centres we strive to keep our services at the forefront of rehabilitative treatment. One recent addition to our services, which has cost the charity

nothing and runs with the help of volunteers, both human and canine, is the introduction of therapy dogs at both St. Andrews and Castlebrae, which is already proving to be a big success.

Recent medical studies have shown that the presence of pets can lower stress and anxiety, improve vital signs, and reduce loneliness and depression, and it has been scientifically proven that the mere action of stroking a dog slows down the heartbeat and reduces blood pressure.

So, introducing; Ann Burrell and her Leonbergers at St. Andrews; and Wilma Hutchinson and her Sprocker Spaniels at Castlebrae. They visit the Centres once a week for a couple of hours and offer comfort, happiness and emotional wellbeing to the patients. Many patients staying at the Centres are dog owners themselves, or even work with dogs, and while away from home or work will be missing their canine companions. As a result they very much enjoy this opportunity to interact, spend some time with, and talk to these very friendly and gorgeous dogs.

The dogs have been a big hit with patients, and staff, at both centres.

The latest on the big build:

Work on Castlebrae's £2.5m redevelopment project is now in its ninth month, with only a couple of months left to go until it is completed and ready for use by patients.

Just in case you are unfamiliar with what is going on at Castlebrae, the works, which started last May, include the construction of a new building which will house a new, larger, treatment pool as well as a hydrotherapy pool. The existing building previously occupied by the old pool will be redeveloped into a new, and again larger, fitness studio, and a new spin-bike studio. This will, in-turn, enable us to double the size of our rehabilitation gym.


At the time of our last update on the work, the two new pools had been excavated and constructed and the steel frame of the building had just been erected. a new small staffroom. Since then we have seen walls constructed, roofs attached and windows fitted. Recent weeks, and even months, have seen snow, rain and storm force winds, which isn't ideal for tiling a roof or fitting large glass roof panels, however, the work carried on and as a result the build is still running to schedule with completion expected in early April.

Inside the new building both the hydrotherapy pool and the main treatment pool have now been tiled and you really get to an absolute minimum over the course a proper sense of just how beneficial the larger pool will be. Internal walls have been constructed to create various other rooms, such as changing rooms, sauna and steam

rooms, a plant room, a laundry room and

The conversion of the existing building that housed the original pool and gym is also progressing with some speed. The work involved here is not quite so extensive but it is nevertheless impressive when you see the size of the new fitness studio and gym. The new spin-bike studio has also now been constructed, as well as much needed storage space for exercise equipment.

Disruption to patients has been kept of the building work, but nevertheless we are all keen to see the finished project, so that the patients can start benefitting from the greatly improved facilities.

Great North Run fundraising helps fund new therapy chair

Phil decided to take part in the GNR and raise money for the PTC following treatment his wife was given.

Phil said "When Anne was diagnosed with MND in 2013 the team at the PTC provided us with the most amazing support and care, and as Anne's condition progresses they continue to do so. Doing the Great North Run on behalf of the PTC is a small way of showing our appreciation for the amazing people who work there and the fantastic service that they provide."

The team raised an incredible £1,665.63, and monies raised were used to purchase a "Therapy Chair" designed for seated back massage. This specialised chair will enable the therapist to work on clients who for instance are pregnant, have breathing issues, are recovering from abdominal surgery or have a mobility issue which would make them uncomfortable lying on a conventional treatment couch.
